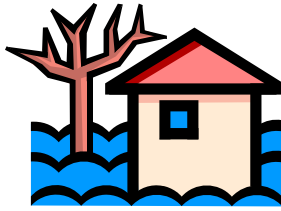


# Thanks to You

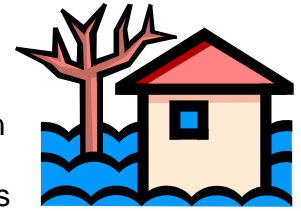
